Introduction to Power BI

- Power BI: A Microsoft business intelligence tool for visualizing, analyzing, and sharing data.
- **Power BI Free / Pro / Premium**: The three main versions of Power BI, each with different features for sharing and scalability.
- Report View: The workspace in Power Bl where users build and interact with data visualizations.
- Data View: The interface showing underlying data tables within a Power BI project.
- Model (Relationship) View: A workspace for managing relationships between datasets.
- **Dimension:** A descriptive attribute (e.g., date, product category) used for grouping or categorizing facts.
- Fact: A quantitative data point (e.g., sales, revenue) typically aggregated for analysis.
- Relationship: A defined link between two tables that allows for combined analysis.
- **Power Query:** A data connection and transformation tool in Power BI for cleaning, reshaping, and loading data.
- M Code: A scripting language used by Power Query to define transformations.
- **Data Category**: A metadata property in Power Bl used to ensure fields are interpreted correctly (e.g., geographic data).
- **Hierarchy**: A structured arrangement of data levels (e.g., Year → Quarter → Month → Day) that allows for drill-down analysis.
- Drill-down: A feature that enables users to explore detailed levels of data within a visualization.
- Interaction: The way one visualization in a Power BI report influences another.
- DAX (Data Analysis Expressions): A formula language used in Power BI to create custom calculations and measures.
- Calculated Column: A new column added to a table using a DAX formula.
- Calculated Table: A new table created using a DAX expression.
- Calculated Measure: A reusable calculation defined using DAX, often aggregating values dynamically.
- Quick Measure: A pre-built DAX calculation created with minimal user input.
- Calculate Function: A powerful DAX function used to modify filter contexts for calculations.
- Explicit Aggregation: A user-defined aggregation in Power BI, such as SUM(Sales) or COUNT(Customers).
- **Dashboard**: A collection of visualizations and reports in Power BI Service designed for monitoring and sharing insights.
- Power BI Service: The online platform for publishing, sharing, and collaborating on Power BI reports.
- **Workspace**: A shared environment in Power BI Service where teams can collaborate on dashboards and reports.
- Data Gateway: A bridge that securely connects on-premises data sources to Power BI Service.
- **Deployment:** The process of publishing and managing Power BI reports and dashboards to users.
